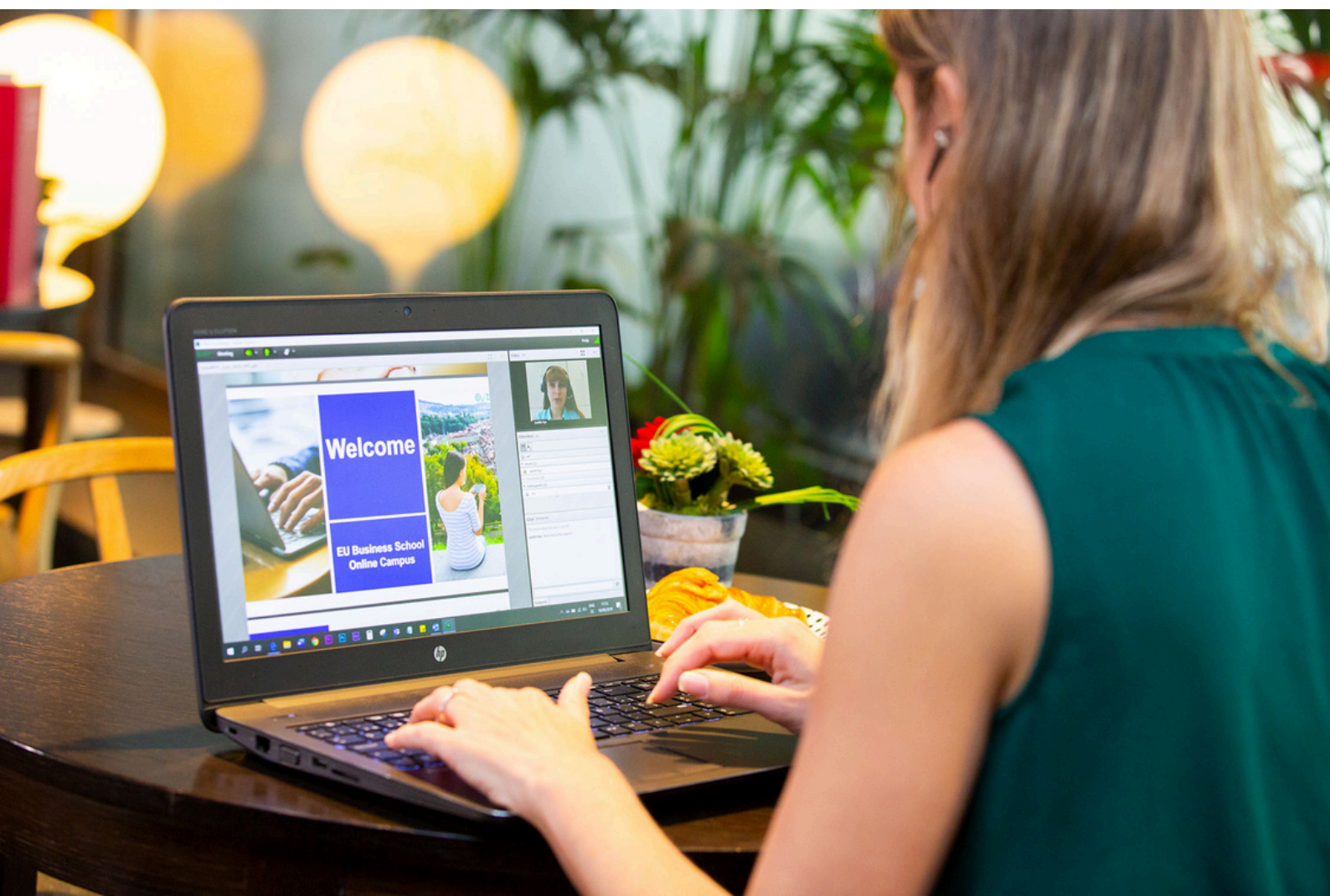

The department offers four main services to students:



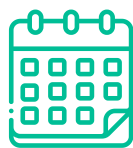
Career guidance and coaching

Career Guidance & Coaching

The EU Career Services Department is dedicated to equipping students with the tools and strategies needed to advance their careers and understand the global job market. We provide personalized coaching and group sessions to enhance career prospects and streamline the job search process. Our aim is to support students as they transition from academia to the professional world, focusing on building their professional identity and personal brand.

Our services cover a range of needs, from exploring career options and changing fields to job searching, interview preparation, and navigating challenging transitions. We also help students lead their careers effectively in a global context.

Workshops & Guest Speaker Sessions

The EU Career Services Department regularly organizes training sessions focused on various aspects of career development.

Topics can range from resume writing and cover letter crafting to networking strategies and interview techniques. Students are provided with industry-specific insights and trends to keep them informed about the job market.

Training Drops

Training drops are 10 or 30-minute, online sessions in which our career advisors give students advice to prepare them for selection processes. These sessions are recorded and available on-demand as a capsule course via Moodle.

Workshops

We organize hands-on coaching and development workshops which are tailored to each program alongside panel discussions, competitions and career speed-dating events. Our workshops cover various topics integral to career development such as job selection, personal branding and contract negotiation.

Guest Speakers

We invite external experts, including professional consultants, coaches and alumni, to share their advice for job-hunting success with insider tips and tricks in the form of masterclasses and workshops.

Internships

At EU Business School, internships are extracurricular, and so, not mandatory. However, participating in an internship is strongly recommended since it's the easiest and most effective way to enter the job market and get a hands-on experience.

Unlike the onsite campuses, the Digital Campus does not offer student visas for a specific location, and so, it is not eligible to sign internship agreements.

However, those students living in Spain, Switzerland or Germany who possess a valid work permit will be considered eligible to sign an internship agreement, in accordance with legal and local regulations.

General Student requirements

- ✔ 3rd year bachelor, master or MBA student
- ✔ Enrolled at EU Business School
- ✔ Valid NIE, if it's in Spain, Switzerland or Germany

Company requirements

- ✔ Contract, Internship agreement or similar
- ✔ Mentorship & follow up

General recommendations

- ✔ Max. 30h per week
- ✔ Max. 20-25h per week (London Met students)
- ✔ Max. 750h during entire program
- ✔ Schedule does not clash with academic calendar

FAQs

Can the careers department find me an internship or a job?

We train students to prepare for the job market, developing new skills and sharing relevant knowledge so they are ready to take the first steps. Students will also benefit from our company network through which we have access to job vacancies via our career portal.

What steps should I take if I'm considering a transfer to another campus?

We recommend reaching out to your academic counselor and the careers department at the campus you wish to transfer to for detailed guidance and assistance.

How do I obtain a work permit?

Each case is different and depends on where you are from. We recommend you contact an external immigration lawyer to help you in this process as the careers department cannot help you obtain a work permit.

What can I do to work toward my future career if I am in the first or second year of my bachelor's program?

We recommend that you develop your base skills and work on your CV and LinkedIn in preparation. We will help you by providing workshops and seminars. See more on page three.

Can I receive help from the careers department once I graduate?

We are always willing to help but once you graduate, your first contact will be the EU Alumni Relations Department, who can provide you with tools to help you expand your professional network and find graduate jobs.
